



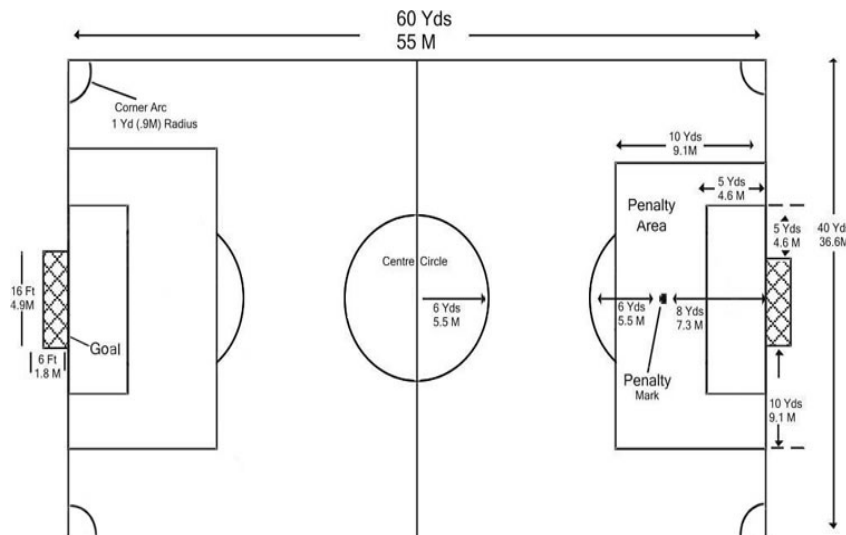
**Newmarket Soccer Club**  
**Laws of the Game**  
**Mini Division (U8 -U10) – Summer 2010**  
**Version - 5.10**

All games shall be played in accordance with FIFA's "Laws of the Game" in conjunction with the OSA.'s published Youth Soccer Rules, unless otherwise modified within these posted Newmarket Soccer Club (NSC.) rules.

Situations not formally covered in these rules will automatically defer to OSA published rules in accordance with FIFA's "Laws of the Game."

**Law 1.0      The Field of Play**

- 1.1      The game shall be played on a field of play as approved and assigned by the NSC.
- 1.2      The Goal Areas and Penalty Area shall be defined by a box drawn on the field of play: A penalty mark shall be made at 8 yards from the midpoint between the goal post and equidistant from them.



**Law 2.0      The Ball**

- 2.1      The game ball shall be an approved size 4.



### Law 3.0            Number of Players

- 3.1            A team roster shall consist of not more than fourteen (14) players.
  - 3.11 All OSA policies regarding player registration shall apply.
  - 3.12 A team found guilty of using an ineligible player shall forfeit the game to their opponent, with a 1-0 score being recorded, and may be subject to further disciplinary action at the discretion of the NSC. A team found guilty of using an ineligible player may be subject to a fine of up to \$500.00.
  - 3.13 The NSC registrar shall rule on all disputes with regards to player registration and the registrar's decision will be final.
- 3.2            The game shall be played by two teams, each consisting of not more than 7 players. Each team must have a designated goalkeeper.
- 3.3            Each team shall provide the referee with a completed, legibly printed game sheet.
- 3.4            Game sheets MUST be given to the referee prior to kick-off. No match shall be started without a game sheet.
- 3.5            Both teams must have at least 5 players to start the game.
- 3.6            The game can not continue if a team has less than 5 players.
- 3.7            The games must start on time or as soon as teams can field the minimum number of players.
- 3.8            Teams will be allowed a maximum fifteen minutes grace period to field the minimum number of players before forfeiting the game. (Halves may have to be reduced due to lighting conditions. This will be at the discretion of the referee.)
- 3.9            Teams unable to field the minimum number of players within fifteen (15) minutes of the scheduled start of play shall be declared in default and the game shall be abandoned at the discretion of the referee.
- 3.10          During game play, teams may only substitute players with the referees consent, as follows:
  - a) On **any** throw in.
  - b) At restart after a goal has been scored.
  - c) At half time or the restart after the conclusion of a period of play (overtime).



- d) On a goal kick.
- e) To replace an injured player should the referee, in his sole opinion, deem there is sufficient cause.
- f) Goalkeeper substitutions may only occur after the conclusion of a period of play, or in the event of an injury.

3.11 No substitution shall be allowed on corner kicks.

3.12 No substitution shall be allowed if, in the sole opinion of the referee, a team is attempting to waste time.

### **3.20 Substitute Player Call-Up**

3.21 If call-ups are used their names must be recorded on the game sheet and circled.

3.22 Only three called-up players may be used per game, to a maximum of 9 players for a Mini team (U-8 – U-10,)

3.23 Call-ups playing for a team must be from the same house league team, and may only be called up 3 times during the season.

3.24 Competitive (Rep) players may not be used as call-ups.

3.25 No call-ups may be used for Soccerfest or playoff games.

### **3.30 Coaching On The Field**

3.31 Coaching on the field will be permitted as follows:

3.32 One coach (or designated team official) only from each team is permitted onto the field to instruct their own players.

3.33 They must position themselves at the side or behind the play (NEVER in front of the player having possession of the ball or in such a way as to obstruct defenders from reaching the ball).

3.33.1 **U8** – One coach or team official per team shall be permitted on the field of play up to but not including July 1, 2010.



3.33.2 **U9** – One coach or team official per team shall be permitted on the field of play up to but not including (Soccerfest) June 25, 2010.

3.33.3 **U10** – Coaches or team officials shall **not** be permitted on the field of play unless invited by the referee.

3.34 **No parent, spectator or coach may sit behind the goal lines.**

### 3.4 **Coaches Technical Area**

3.41 The technical area is defined as a designated seating area for coaching staff and substitutes.

3.42 The technical area extends 1 metre (yard) on either side of the designated seated area and extends forward up to a distance of 1 metre (yard) from the touch line.

3.43 The occupants of the technical area, (ie. Coaching staff) must be identified prior to kick-off.

3.44 The coach and other officials must remain within its confines except in special circumstances, for example when given permission by the referee to enter the field of play to assess player injury.

3.45 The coach and other occupants of the technical area **must behave in a responsible manner**.

3.46 Coaching staff may be asked to leave the technical area if they are deemed by the referee to be acting in a manner that is disruptive or disrespectful to any participants. Any such misconduct will be subject to NSC discipline.

3.47 In the event a game is abandoned, the NSC Mini Director shall decide the result of the game. The offending team(s) shall be subject to any disciplinary action deemed appropriate by the NSC Discipline Committee in accordance with O.S.A. Policy 9.0.

3.48 Any game abandoned by a game official will be dealt with by the Club Discipline Committee. A team found guilty of causing a game abandonment will



forfeit the points and may be subject to a fine of up to five hundred dollars (\$500.00).

#### **Law 4.0          Players' Equipment**

- 4.1          A player must wear the proper uniform as provided by the N.S.C., including numbered team jersey, shorts, and matching stockings.
- 4.2          A player must wear shin guards that provide a reasonable degree of protection and that are fully covered by the stockings.
- 4.3          A player must wear footwear. Soccer shoes with rubber or plastic cleats are highly recommended.
- 4.4          A player must not use equipment or wear anything which endangers themselves or other players including:
  - Splints or hard casts (constructed of plaster, fibreglass or metal) even if covered
  - Leg braces which contain exposed hard materials such as plastic, fibreglass or metal.
  - Metal cleats
  - **No jewellery of any kind.** This includes, but is not limited to, necklaces, rings, bracelets, earrings, leather or rubber bands or visible body piercings. ***(Exception: Medic Alert Bracelets are allowed but must be taped. The taping should be such that the description of the medical problem is clearly visible.)***
  - Loose beaded hair is also not permitted unless tied back or covered by a net.
  - bobby pins, metal or hard plastic hair clips
- 4.5          No bandanas, sweatbands or hats may be worn by players. (Exception: the goalkeeper may wear a hat provided it contains no metal or hard plastic parts.) Only head protectors permitted by FIFA are allowed.



- 4.6 **Religious head gear:** As per OSA directive (Law 4 Update – 2007), it is appropriate for players to wear items such as the hijab provided it does not pose a danger to the player or to other players.
- 4.7 **Eyeglasses:** If a player wears glasses on the field, **they must be an approved sport glasses type.**
- 4.8 The goalkeeper must wear colours which distinguish him/her from all outfield players and from the referee.

#### **Law 5.0 The Referee**

- 5.1 The referee controls the match and has full authority to enforce the Laws of the Game.
- 5.2 The decisions of the referee regarding the facts of the game are deemed to be, “in the opinion of the referee” and as such, are final.
- 5.3 The referee controls who may enter or leave the field of play.
- 5.4 The referee must provide a written report, to the appropriate authority, regarding any misconduct by players, parents, coaches, spectators, or other persons which takes place on the field of play or its vicinity at any time during the game.
- 5.5 The referee must stop the game immediately if a player appears to be injured or bleeding.
- 5.6 Both the referee and the Coaches will ensure that all players move away from an injured player but remain standing. **(“Taking a knee” or sitting on the field in a sporting manner is unnecessary and can result in confusion as to who is actually injured and in need of attention, and as well may cause muscle cramping from sudden player inactivity.)**
- 5.7 The referee ensures that the players’ equipment meets the requirements of Law 4.
- 5.8 The referee is the sole authority for abandoning games due to unsafe field conditions, weather, outside interference, or any other cause. Should the Referee abandon a game for any cause an S.I.R. (Special Incident Report) must be submitted by the



referee within 48 hours to the office, detailing the reasons for which the game was abandoned.

- 5.9 The referee shall submit the white and green copies of the completed game sheet to the office within 48 hours of the completion of the game. The referee shall submit the yellow copies of the completed game sheet to the home team, and the pink copy to the away team, at the completion of the game. The gold copy shall be kept by the referee and submitted to the office for payment at the end of each month.
- 5.10 It is the responsibility of the coaches to protect our referees from abuse, verbal or otherwise, regardless of the source, including parents and spectators.
- 5.11 Coaches, managers, and team officials shall not criticize or question game officials, at any time and shall encourage the same attitude amongst all players and supporters.
- 5.12 Coaches, managers and team officials shall not approach the referee in order to voice their opinions.
- 5.13 The coach shall be encouraged to complete a referee evaluation to assist the club in evaluating the quality of its referees.
- 5.14 Referees names are not to be distributed, under any circumstances.
- 5.15 Evaluation reports, not directly from the coach, should refer only to the date, time, and field location so that they may be tracked by the referee evaluators.
- 5.16 **Any verbal or physical abuse of a referee or assistant referee from a coach, parent or spectator WILL NOT BE TOLERATED and will result in automatic game/membership suspension pending the results of formal disciplinary review or subsequent hearing(s).\***

## Law 6.0 The Assistant Referee

- 6.1 No assistant referees shall be assigned.
- 6.2 At the discretion of the referee, each team shall provide a designated "linesperson" to assist the referee in calling the ball **in and out of play, only**.

## Law 7.0 Duration of the Match

- 7.1 The match shall consist of two equal halves with a half time interval of no more than 5 minutes.
- 7.2 U8 2x20 minute halves
- 7.3 U9 2x25 minute halves
- 7.4 U10 2x30 minute halves
- 7.5 If for any reason a game is terminated by the referee before full time, the Director shall determine the outcome of the game.
- 7.6 The referee shall record the time the game was abandoned on the game sheet under 'referee's report.'

## Law 8.0 Start of Play

- 8.1 At the beginning of the game, a coin is tossed and the team that wins the toss decides which goal (side) it will defend in the first half of the match.
- 8.2 The other team takes the kick-off (gets the ball) to start the match.
- 8.3 In the second half of the match, the teams change ends and attack opposite goals. (The team that won the toss at the beginning of the match takes the kick-off to start the second half of the match.)
- 8.4 At the kick-off, all players shall be in their own half of the field, and not less than 6 yards from the ball.



- 8.5 The player taking the kick-off may not kick the ball a second time until it has been played, or touched, by another player.
- 8.6 A goal may be scored directly from a kick-off.

#### **Law 9.0 Ball In and Out of Play**

- 9.1 The ball is out of play when it has wholly crossed the goal line or the touch line whether on the ground or in the air, or when play has been stopped by the referee.

#### **Law 10.0 Method of Scoring**

- 10.1 A goal is scored when the whole of the ball passes over the goal line, between the goalposts and under the crossbar, provided that no infringement of the Laws of the Game has been committed previously by the team scoring the goal.
- 10.2 A goal may not be scored directly from a kick off.

#### **Law 11.0 Offside**

- 11.1 The offside rule shall not apply.
- 11.2 In the event a player/team persistently abuses the spirit of the offside rule, (i.e. cherry-picking), the referee will issue a warning to the coach of the team involved. If the warning is not heeded, an indirect free kick will be awarded to the opposing team at the point of the infraction.

#### **Law 12.0 Fouls and Misconducts**

- 12.1 A player, who in the opinion of the referee intentionally commits any of the following offences, shall be penalized by the awarding of a free-kick to the opposing team:
  - Spits at an opponent, kicks or attempts to kick an opponent, trips or attempts to trip an opponent, jumps at an opponent, charges an opponent,



strikes or attempts to strike an opponent, holds an opponent, pushes an opponent, handles the ball deliberately, (except a goalkeeper from within his own penalty area,) or tackles an opponent to gain possession of the ball, making contact with the opponent before touching the ball.

- 12.2 Should a player commit one of the above offences within his own penalty-area, a penalty-kick shall be awarded.
- 12.3 Only the goalkeeper may handle the ball within the penalty area.
- 12.4 The six second rule shall apply. (Referees have been instructed to give a "generous" six seconds.)
- 12.5 Standard discipline penalties for participant misconduct will be rendered from OSA Policy 9.0 in accordance with NSC Recreational Discipline Policy.

### **Law 13.0 Free Kicks**

- 13.1 Free kicks are awarded at the discretion of the referee.
- 13.2 Free kicks can be either direct (one touch) or indirect (two touch).
- 13.3 The kick shall be taken at the point where the infringement occurred.
- 13.4 All opposing players must remain 6 yards from the ball at the taking of a free kick.
- 13.5 If the kicker touches the ball a second time before it has been played or touched by another player, a free kick shall be awarded to the opposing team.
- 13.6 Ball In Play - For a player taking a free-kick, within his own penalty-area, the ball shall be in play when it has been kicked and moved, and has passed outside the penalty-area.
- 13.7 All opponents shall be outside the penalty-area and not less than 6 yards from the ball until it has been kicked.
- 13.8 For any infringement of this rule, the free-kick shall be retaken.
- 13.9 A goal may be scored directly from a **direct** (one touch) free kick.
- 13.10 A goal may not be scored directly from an **indirect** (two touch) free kick.



## **Law 14.0      Penalty Kick**

- 14.1      Penalty kicks shall be taken from the penalty spot and all players must remain 6 yards from the ball and behind the penalty spot which is 8 yards from the goal line.
- 14.2      The goalkeeper shall remain on his own goal-line facing the kicker, and between the goal-posts, until the ball has been kicked. (Note: The goalkeeper may move from side to side; however he/she may not move forward off the goal line until the ball is kicked forward.)
- 14.3      The ball shall be in play when it is kicked and moves forward.
- 14.4      If the kicker touches the ball a second time before it has been played or touched by another player, a free kick shall be awarded to the defending team.
- 14.5      If necessary, play shall be extended to allow a penalty-kick to be taken.

## **Law 15.0      Throw-In**

- 15.1      When the whole of the ball crosses over the touch-line, either on the ground or in the air, the ball shall be thrown-in from the point where it left the field of play, by a member of the team opposing that of the player who last played or touched it.
- 15.2      The player taking the throw-in shall face the field of play, have part of each foot on the touch line or on the ground outside the touch line, use both hands, and deliver the ball from behind and over their head.
- 15.3      If the player fails to throw the ball in correctly, he/she shall be permitted a second attempt. If the second attempt is unsuccessful, a throw-in shall be awarded to the opposing team.
- 15.4      The ball will be in play as soon as it enters the field of play.
- 15.5      If the thrower touches the ball a second time before it has been played or touched by another player, a free kick shall be awarded to the opposing team.
- 15.6      At the taking of a throw in, all opponents must be at least 2 yards from the ball.
- 15.7      An opponent may not unfairly distract or impede the thrower.
- 15.8      A goal may not be scored directly from a throw-in.



## **Law 16.0      Goal Kick**

- 16.1      When the whole of the ball passes over the goal-line, either on the ground or in the air, having last been played or touched by a member of the attacking team, a goal-kick shall be awarded to the defending team.
- 16.2      Goal kicks may be taken from any point within the goal area.
- 16.3      All opposing players must be outside the penalty area.
- 16.4      If the kicker touches the ball a second time before it has been played or touched by another player, a free kick shall be awarded to the opposing team.
- 16.5      The ball must leave the penalty area before it may be played by either team.
- 16.6      Should an infraction occur the goal kick shall be retaken.
- 16.7      A goal may be scored directly from a goal kick.

## **Law 17.0      Corner Kick**

- 17.1      When the whole of the ball has crossed the goal-line, either on the ground or in the air, having last been played or touched by a member of the defending team, a corner-kick shall be awarded to the attacking team.
- 17.2      The corner-kick shall be taken from within the corner-arc nearest to where the ball crossed the goal-line.
- 17.3      All opponents shall be not less than 6 yards from the ball until it has been kicked.
- 17.4      The ball is in play when it is kicked and moves.
- 17.5      If the kicker touches the ball a second time before it has been played or touched by another player, a free kick shall be awarded to the defending team.
- 17.6      A goal may be scored directly from a corner kick.



## Appendix I

### **DISCIPLINE BY REVIEW (DBR) & DISCIPLINE BY HEARING (DBH)**

#### **\*\*RECREATIONAL DIVISIONS\*\***

Standard Discipline penalties for misconduct will be rendered from the OSA "Policy 9.0" Tables #5, #6 & #7. (See Appendix II) (These tables will be placed on the NSC web site and will also be posted in the office) The penalty range indicates the recommended minimum & maximum penalties for the offence. (Common sense & fairness will also be used in determining and administrating suspensions).

#### **For Players**

- DBR will be conducted by the Discipline Panel for any infraction or misconduct that has a three (3) game suspension or less.
- DBH will be conducted by the Discipline Chairman (DC) and at least 2 other persons for any infraction or misconduct that has a greater than three (3) game suspension.

#### **For Coaches and Others**

- DBR will be conducted by the Discipline Panel for any misconduct indicated in writing or by Special Incident Report (S.I.R.) that has a four (4) game suspension or less.
- DBH - Discipline by full Discipline Hearing Committee will be conducted for all other forms of misconduct.

The Discipline Committee will determine whether the incident is handled by the NSC or must be forwarded on to the District or O.S.A. for further action.

#### **Game Official Assault** – (whether by player, Coach or Other)

- Any person charged with Referee Assault will be immediately suspended from all soccer related activities and reported to the O.S.A.

#### **Note**

- Persons up for discipline will be contacted by the Discipline Chairman (D.C.) and will be notified of the process or procedure that will take place.
- The name of the suspended player(s) will be sent via e-mail to the Division Director, Head Referee and the NSC who will post the name(s) in the office and



on our Web site.

- The name of suspended “Coaches & Others” will be sent via e-mail to the Division Director, Technical Director & Club President.
- Persons (registered as senior recreational players) who must attend or request to have DBH will be required to pay a \$25.00 non-refundable fee.

### **Appeals**

- Persons wishing to appeal the decision of the Discipline Committee must do so in writing, to the NSC, within 14 days of the decision being handed down. A payment or fee of \$100.00 must accompany the appeal request. This fee will be refunded if the appeal is upheld.
- Note: An appeal will only be considered if at least one of the following happens:
  - 1) New evidence not presented at the hearing comes to light
  - 2) A violation of the process occurs
  - 3) Excessive penalty or suspension handed down.

**Remember: The Referee’s decision is final and cannot be appealed**

### **DATE FOR DBR & DBH**

- Every Tuesday evening at 0700 pm will be set as the time and date for DBR & DBH. (Special circumstances may preclude and another date will have to be selected)
- Having these sessions every Tuesday will allow the NSC to address important issues of Misconduct, such as Violent Conduct, Verbal Abuse of the Referee & etc., very quickly.
- The Safety of all our members and the fairness of the process is paramount.

### **NOTE**

- Any player or coach who is dismissed or ejected from a game will automatically be suspended from their next scheduled game. This will give the DC and the committee the time necessary to conduct “DBR” or “DBH”. The person(s) affected will be contacted by the DC as to any further suspensions and or procedures.
